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### MAGIS Core: How Does This Work for Students?

- Goal: Common experience for students in all schools
- Discipline-based Core / tiered experience (Orientation & Exploration)
- Reduction in number of courses from 20 to 15
- 22 Curricular Requirements
- Introduced SIGNATURE ELEMENTS:
  - 3 Writing Across the Curriculum (WAC)/Writing in the Discipline (WID) 2 within Orientation and Exploration, +1 course in Orientation and Exploration (WAC) or within a Major (WID)
  - *3 Social Justice Experiences (SJ) SJ1, SJ2, SJR -* 2 within Orientation and Exploration, + 1 course in Orientation and Exploration **or** within a Major
  - 1 Interdisciplinary Experience (ID) within Orientation and Exploration

# *MAGIS* Core – How Can We Best Advise Students?

- Use renumbered Advising Materials online:
  - Existing Core (classes 2022 and 2021) vs. *Magis* Core (class of 2023 and beyond)
  - One-page sheet for *Magis* Core requirements
  - One-page sheet with Honors requirements
  - List of all the signature element courses for Fall 2020
- Plan to have students take at least two to three courses in core
- Inform students that Orientation courses should be taken in 1<sup>st</sup> two years, and Exploration courses can be taken in 1st through 4<sup>th</sup> year

### How Can I Advise My Major Students?

- Advise students to be flexible and consider taking Exploration course in Year One (e.g., POLI 1101, SOCI 1100, THTR 1011)
- Consider offering students the option to take a WID course as a capstone
- Honors Students will fulfill some of their core courses with HONR seminars
- Share Undergraduate Curriculum plan with Core Director (DSB, Egan, Engineering, GSEAP)

### Magis Core: Academic Policies to Consider

- AP Credits (score of 4+) cannot count towards Orientation (Tier 1); can count for Orientation (Tier 2). Same goes for transfer courses
  - Exceptions can be made for transfer students on a case by case basis
- Courses taken in high school for college credit must meet criteria outlined in the College Credit Policy and be vetted by ASR
- Taking classes Elsewhere-Summer/Winter Course Approval
  - Please refer student to respective Assistant Dean/Director in Dean's Office
  - Courses must be pre-approved to ensure policy is upheld
  - When possible students are encouraged to consider courses offered through Fairfield (online or face to face)
  - Limited to 2 courses per term/total of 5 post matriculation

### Degree Evaluation

- Sometimes classes do not align where they should. If there is a discrepancy towards the major:
  - Contact Sue Bickel (<u>sbickel@Fairfield.edu</u>) of the change that should occur. Be specific!
    - ELST 1002 should be counting towards major requirement \_\_\_\_\_
  - Ensure that your department chair approves of this adjustment (especially if you are making an exception)
- Be mindful of the graduation year/term and the amount of credits left to graduate
  - Any questions-contact Assistant Deans/Directors
- If students are pursuing double majors in different degree programs (B.A./B.S.) you must use the drop down menu in DW to toggle between the two majors

- If a student's registration time is incorrect, please contact the respective Dean's Office for trouble shooting
- Remember that it stays open all the way through add/drop (closed for short period for summer orientation)
- Students can add/drop on their own. They may run into issues if they do not have a pre-req or the class is restricted to majors (and they are not declared in that major)
